

OFFICIAL CALL, NINTH ANNUAL CONVENTION

NATIONAL CONGRESS OF COLORED PARENTS AND TEACHERS

All duly credited delegates and representatives of the National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers are called to meet in Tallahassee, Florida, July 28-31, 1935, as the guests of the Florida Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers. Headquarters, Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College. Theme: "HOMEMAKING EDUCATION."

MEETINGS

All sessions and public meetings will be held at the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College. The Executive Board meets July 28, 2 P. M., at which time the Executive Secretary and the National President will read their reports. The Credentials Committee meets 9:00 A. M., July 29. All delegates, both visiting and voting, should register at the Registration Booth. Registration fee, \$1.00, admits voting and visiting delegates to all sessions and entertainments. All registered delegates will receive an official badge and convention literature.

BOARD AND LODGING

Suitable accommodations have been provided for the delegates and visitors. Rates 75c per person; meals will be served at reasonable prices in the Cafeteria of the College. Persons desiring rooming facilities should write Mr. H. M. Efferson, Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College, Tallahassee, Fla.

PROGRAM

The Program will include classes and discussions of "HOMEMAKING EDUCATION", Developing Social Responsibility in the Community, reports of Departments and National Chairmen as well as Problems from special localities and certain Phases of the work.

EXHIBITS

All exhibits from state and local units should be sent to the Executive Secretary at the Florida State Agricultural and Mechanical College, Tallahassee, Fla., not later than July 27, as on that date she will direct the installation of all Exhibits. The National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers nor the Executive Secretary will be responsible for exhibits.

REPORTS

All Reports must be written (limited to 1000 words) and a copy of the same left with the Secretary. All Directors and National Chairmen are expected to make a report of their work at the Convention.

RESOLUTIONS

Resolutions must be prepared in proper form, typed or written, and presented to the chairman of the Resolutions Committee.

REPRESENTATION

National By-Laws, Article VI. Section 2. Each State Branch shall be entitled to be represented at the annual meeting of the National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers by its president, recording secretary, corresponding secretary, treasurer, or their alternates; and one delegate for every two (200) hundred members, in good standing as shown on the books of the treasurer of the National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers.

Section 3. The meeting of the National Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers shall be open to all members of the Congress, but the privilege of making motions, debating, and voting shall be limited to the members of the Executive Board and to the accredited representatives from each State Branch. A voting member shall have but one vote although entitled to vote in either of several capacities.

Delegates are urged to bring copies of their P.-T. A. songs, Bulletin and Year Book.

President J. R. E. Lee, of the Florida Agricultural and Mechanical College, extends a most cordial invitation to our National to meet on the campus of this famous College and assures us that every arrangement will be made to make our convention a success and the stay of our delegates pleasant. Mrs. E. B. Baker, President of the Florida Congress of Colored Parents and Teachers, with the cooperation of the Florida units is making plans for a good time socially.
